



Medication Assisted Treatment Prescriber Recovery Support Services

The Mountain Center's Recovery Support Services Program serves people with opioid use, other substance use, and mental health disorders. These services focus on medication-assisted treatment, case navigation, counseling services, and HIV/HCV testing, and treatment.

This position that supports the Recovery Support Services Program is for a licensed New Mexico Medical Doctor, Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant to provide Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) services by prescribing Suboxone for clients with opioid use disorders. This position is part-time 24 hours per week in-person at our Española office location.

Responsibilities:

- Prescribe buprenorphine and other medication assisted treatment for TMC clients enrolled in the Recovery Support Services program.
- Provides services to support new client assessments and current client follow-ups.
- Work closely with Española office staff to make client referrals to internal programs or external community services, as needed.
- Work closely with Española Office Program Manager to problem solve needs and evaluate program delivery.
- Support client access to low barrier MAT services and client engagement.
- Provide and support quality assurance for the program.
- Conduct a minimum of 30 client appointments per week.
- Upload client information and client notes in the EMR database and make sure the information is ready for billing.
- Along with other medical support staff, review the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) at every client visit.
- Participate in regular team meetings to discuss client progress, challenges, and improvements to the intake process.
- As assigned, supports Española Office Program Manager with community presentations on the MAT program.
- Other job duties as assigned by the direct supervisor.

Qualifications:

- License in the State of New Mexico as a M.D., N.P. or P.A. in good standing.
- Experience working in addiction medicine.
- Sound understanding of all federal and state regulations including HIPAA and OSHA.
- Current DEA, NPI and Medicaid number.
- Experience directly related to the duties outlined above
- Excellent time management skills as well as meeting deadlines
- Excellent communication (written, oral, electronically)
- Pass a CYFD criminal background check
- Knowledge of the following:
 - Overdose Prevention, Recognition and Response training
 - Addiction (Substance use and misuse)
 - CPR/First Aid (Certification preferred)
 - Health Promotion and Prevention Education
- Ability to maintain highly confidential information in a professional manner (in accordance with federal HIPAA and 42CFR part 2 regulations)
- Possesses the mental resolve to deal with complex, highly emotional and/or stressful situations
- Excellent interpersonal skills with the ability to effectively listen and offer solutions without passing judgment
- Ability to communicate in English, both verbally and in writing
- Ability to work with others in a team and collaboration efforts
- Proficient in Microsoft Office including Word, Outlook, Access and Excel
- Working knowledge of standard office equipment (personal computer/laptop, phone with voicemail, fax, copier, etc.)
- Familiarity with the social, cultural and economic make-up of New Mexico or service area and ability and willingness to work with diverse populations.

Preferred:

- Bilingual, English and Spanish

The position provides 24 hours of work per week/weekends; salary range is up to \$50-75/hour depending on experience and qualifications. The Mountain Center is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
